

As a seventeen-year-old living through the era of self-love, I wasn't surprised when I saw ten-year-olds with skincare routines longer than my entire morning one on my For-You page. What shocked me was how the internet reacted when ten-year-olds began to storm Sephora stores with a hunger for Drunk Elephant bronzing drops and Rare Beauty blushes.

Adults began to film young girls throwing fits inside stores after making a mess of communal tester products. Hundreds of videos of tweens racking up giant charges of luxury perfumes, foundations, and cosmetics flooded TikTok and Instagram. But these 15-second documentaries weren't the end, and what turned from sympathy for Sephora workers became one of the biggest jokes on TikTok.

Influencers and adults began to make parodies of their behavior, donning cheap wigs and baggy t-shirts, acting in sketches where they were the Sephora ten-year-olds wreaking havoc on innocent shoppers and employees. In the comments of these videos, adults began to demand age limits for shoppers at Sephora countering the brand's slogan, "We Belong to Something Beautiful."

The intention of this article is not to excuse the behavior of tweens who ruined communal tester goods and talked down to employees. I knew there had to be an explanation for why elementary schoolers were flocking to makeup counters. While some experts have chalked it up to influencer culture, I felt the cause ran deeper than "I saw my favorite TikToker use Glow Recipe, so I must use Glow Recipe." Part of me wondered if cosmetic brands had found a new group to capitalize on. In the past we had seen young girls afraid of gaining weight and counting calories, and now we saw them buying anti-aging skin creams to heal non-existent wrinkles on their face.

To find out for myself, I took a trip to a local mall and interviewed parents and young shoppers who were able to give me their perspectives on why Sephora had become the mecca of beauty for young girls. Ranging in age from five to 16, girls and their moms agreed that a trip to the mall to pick up cosmetics was fun and needed to maintain proper skin care. Each girl had a common denominator between them though: everyone was there under the guidance of their mother.

There as almost a teacher, their mothers would advise them on what was best on their skin, swatching products on their skin, acting like each girl's personal makeup guru. However, that didn't stop the girls from citing the opinions of friends. It seemed that every young shopper was following along with the trends at school.

If it was tacky to wear anything but lip gloss to school, then they refused to buy anything but lip gloss. If it was embarrassing to not have 15 *Sol De Janeiro* products, their baskets would be filled to the brim with the colorful bottles. In their eyes the influencers online were fun to watch, but not anything they aspired to be.

And this simple idea of "I do it because the other women/girls around me do it," makes sense. Our lives are filled with parents, siblings, friends, dermatologists, salespeople, and others, all waiting to lather on advice. The viral videos that had captured girls throwing fits over brands had missed a crucial piece of the puzzle. These fits and tantrums ran deeper than the need to chase the latest TikTok trend. Brands, and the world, have made young girls feel that without a certain product they would never be able to achieve true beauty. And this product was different for everyone. For some it was Drunk Elephant, for others it was the face washes their dermatologist recommended, or even just the lip mask their mom used.

The commonality between the young girls I interviewed was simple: they were seeking out their own kind of beauty specific to their community, just like many generations before them had done. And while I can't say that makeup counters are free from product-hungry tweens, I can say if the shoppers are as insightful and kind as the young girls that let me interview them, our tester products should be safe (for now).

Weighing the Evidence ON WEIGHT LOSS DRUGSS

More than 70% of the US population is now considered either overweight (BMI > 27) or obese (BMI > 30) Multiple factors have contributed to this weight gain epidemic which include excess caloric intake, more sedentary lifestyles, increased stress and decreased sleep patterns.

For decades, attempts to find effective weight loss drugs have been undertaken with very little success. Many of the earlier drugs were taken off the market because they caused heart valve complications, increased the risk of depression, suicidal ideation, cancers or had intolerable gastrointestinal side effects.

Recently a class of medications called GLP1 agonists have received a lot of attention for their weight loss potential. Drugs in this class include dulaglutide (Trulicity) semaglutide (Ozempic, Wegovy and Rybelsus) and tirzepatide (Mounjaro). They were all initially indicated for lowering glucose in type II diabetics but later found to also significantly lower weight between 15-50 pounds. Bv enhancing the effects of the body's own glucose lowering peptide, these drugs work in a variety of different ways -improving pancreatic and liver function as well as impacting the brain appetite center and delaying gastric emptying. Many of the medication side effects are related to the latter property. Overconsumption of food or drinks results in nausea, vomiting, bloating and sometimes diarrhea or constipation. Many of these symptoms can be overcome by reducing portion size, spacing out meals with small snacks and gradually up titrating the medication dose. These drugs are

given as a simple self-administered injection on a weekly basis.

As word of the weight loss success of the medications grew, it became the drug of choice for many Hollywood celebrities wanting to lose a few pounds. Soon after, many individuals who did not necessarily need the medication began utilizing the drug, resulting in a worldwide shortage that is slowly being remedied. Presently most insurance companies do not cover the drug in non-diabetics, considering it a lifestyle medication rather than medical necessity.

So the question becomes does hype have merit? The early answer appears to be a resounding yes. In patients with type 2 diabetes in addition to lowering glucose and causing weight loss these drugs reduce the risk of heart attacks strokes and cardiovascular death.

In patients with obesity and heart failure a recent study showed semaglutide significantly improves symptoms and quality of life in conjunction with weight loss. Ongoing studies hope to also show that it will reduce hospitalization for heart failure.

In November 2023, during the American Heart Association meeting, the 17604 patients, a five year follow-up SELECT study presented their findings of using semaglutide in overweight and obese patients who are NOT diabetic but already have cardiovascular disease. The top line results released show that this therapy reduces future cardiovascular death, heart attacks and strokes by 20% making this a cardioprotective drug rather than a lifestyle therapy.

While diet and exercise remain the mainstay for weight loss, this new class of medications offers the promise of doing more than just keeping your weight down. As always, a discussion on the use of these medications should be held in conjunction with advice from your health care professional.

A Modern Approach to Abnormal Uterine Bleeding (AUB)

Do you ever wonder if your periods are too long, too short, come too often, do not come often enough, or are too heavy in flow?

If so, you are not alone. All of these concerns fall into an umbrella category in gynecology known as abnormal uterine bleeding (or AUB). AUB makes up 1/3 of office visits to the gynecologist! AUB can typically be divided into two main categories - structural and functional causes. Structural causes include things such as polyps and fibroids, which can be easily assessed in our office with an ultrasound. Functional causes can be related to your thyroid, your ability to ovulate, and other hormones your body makes - which can also be assessed in our office through lab tests. The wonderful thing about AUB is it can easily be treated by your gynecologist. Prior to treatment, if you are of a certain age or have particular risk factors - recommendations may include a procedure to evaluate your uterine cavity such as an endometrial biopsy or hysteroscopy to rule out any potential worrisome reasons

behind your abnormal bleeding. Treatment options most commonly include hormonal options such as different forms of birth control, nonhormonal options such as TXA, as well as surgical options. Surgical options such as removal of polyps or endometrial ablations can be performed in our office in a minimally invasive way. We have the ability to perform these procedures using no incisions, minimal anesthesia, and patients go back home the same day. If more definitive treatment options are desired for women who no longer desire childbearing, our practice is comprised of Davinci certified robotic surgeons who can perform hysterectomies with a minimally invasive approach. These hysterectomies are done through small incisions in the abdomen allowing shorter hospital stay, less pain, and quicker recovery. Whether your desire is simply to understand why your periods are irregular/ heavy or you desire definitive treatment to ultimately stop the bleeding, or you have any goal in between, we encourage you to make an appointment to see us today.



Two Moms on a Mission

Four years ago, Beth Burns and Tammy Miller met. They began sharing information about their families. More than 25 years earlier, both families had adopted children with special needs. During their conversation they soon realized they had a mutual concern: "Who would permanently care for our children once we were unable to? Where will they live? Who will continue to care for them?"

Beth and Tammy's subsequent discussions ultimately led to their vision and current mission: to build and provide affordable, permanent, lifetime homes to adults with disabilities. Thus, the plan for Keystone Village was born. It will be a sustainable, not-for-profit residential community where individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities will find their forever homes. And it will provide peace of mind for their families, they envision.

They commended the Forsyth County School system that they said had provided consistent, compassionate care and attention to their children. But eventually they graduated, or 'transitioned' from high school. However, there are no 24/7 programs for adults with special needs. Fortunately, filling some of the void comes from Creative Enterprises of Forsyth, a day service program for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities that provides socialization, encouragement, and job training. But they must go home at night.

Lisa Bennett is regional manager of Creative Enterprises in Forsyth County. She was previously a special education teacher. Forsyth County is one of four locations, including Lawrenceville, Dawsonville, and White County. The Cumming location was established in 2016 with 6 clients. The local program now has 100. They vary in age from 19 to 60, but there is no 'aging out.' Lisa said that clients can participate as long as necessary. The hours of operation are 9am to 3pm, Monday – Friday.

"We provide an educational day program, not just daycare," she emphasized. "We focus on education and job training to help many of our clients get jobs and become as independent as possible. But Keystone Village will provide such a critical need in Forsyth County. It will inspire families to have hope for their loved ones," she said.

In 2020 Forsyth County Commissioners authorized Brackin and Associates to conduct a survey of residents with a family member in the transitional ages from 14-21 with developmental disabilities to determine the housing options available in the county. The survey, funded by a grant from the State of Georgia and supported by Commissioner Cindy Mills and then Lieutenant Governor Geoff Duncan, showed that the great majority live with family members. The survey also showed that options for affordable housing for them are extremely limited. Many respondents, according to the survey, also were concerned that after they died, their loved ones would be placed in 'host homes,' described as adult foster care, and would be 'pushed from home to home?

Commissioner Mills has long been active in advocating for mental healthcare. "Several years ago, a constituent with special needs children asked me if so much money can be spent on animal shelters, why not more on people with special needs? It hit me hard," she said. "What could I say? Forsyth County is so good with special needs students. But when they are out of the school system, they will continue to need care for many years, particularly when parents or family members can no longer care for them. It is a complex issue. "That's why I am so encouraged about Keystone Village," Mills continued. "Creative Enterprises provides a great service for special needs adults during the day. But since they must leave at night, the long-term challenge remains. Keystone Village will fill that need for permanent 24-hour care.

"My hope for the future for people with developmental disabilities and their loved ones would be that Forsyth County could become a place of safe harbor for them where they could grow old in an inclusive community that would both protect them and love them and give them the opportunities to be all that God created them to be," Commissioner Mills added.

Tammy said, "I once heard that if you want to discover your passion, then think of what makes you really sad and then do something to change it. Growing up with my fantastic parents, who adopted 5 of my 8 sisters was beyond amazing. The thought of children not having a family made me and my husband incredibly sad, especially when we learned children with special needs are often labeled as 'unadoptable?

"That became the foundation of our passion. God blessed us with an incredible community where all 12 of our children could play, learn, love, be loved and thrive! We are realistic in knowing we cannot care for our children with

disabilities forever, and this makes us very sad. So now a new passion is born. We dream of developing a community which resembles our home as much as possible so our adult children with IDD can continue to love and be loved in this most incredible Forsyth County," Tammy added. Seven of Tammy's and her husband's children are adopted.

Beth remarked, "Over the past 30 years our family has done everything possible to give our son's life, with all the limitations due to his disabilities, 'a life of limitless opportunity.' Our vision for Keystone Village is to create a similar environment for our residents, so that they are able to thrive with the love, care, and support they receive every day. Keystone will be a residential forever home choice. Our residents' lives will be enhanced by living on our campus, a campus that will be part of the greater, inclusive community around us. Those residing at Keystone will receive the support they require through individualized, provider services. Our foremost desire is that each resident's life reaches its full potential, with endless possibilities as a valued family member of the Keystone Village community."

- Those in Forsyth County Schools: 881
- Those of 'transition' age: 308
- Disabilities intellectual: 84%, autism: 58% (including w/other disability), limited mobility: 15%, require a wheelchair: 13%
- Current housing arrangements living with parents/guardians: 96%
- Between 45 and 59 years: 62%, Over 64 years: 21%

Forsyth County Commissioners recently approved unanimously zoning for Keystone Village. The land has been donated by land developer Pacific Group. It is located in north Forsyth County off Settingdown Road on Marsett Parkway.

CAR MAINTENANCE MYTHS DEBUNKED



A lot has changed over the years when it comes to car maintenance. Some 'absolutes' regarding caring for your car are no longer true due to changing technology, while others were never true despite the many folks who 'know' them to be correct. Let's look at the most common myths out there.

- **Higher octane gasoline will give you more power.** Nope. If your car requires 87 octane and you fill up with anything more, you are wasting your dollars. However, it is true that running a lower than required octane level (as specified in the owner's manual), will hurt your available horsepower as the engine has to retard timing to compensate for the faster burning fuel. Higher octane just means slower burning fuel. Strange but true.
- Warming up your engine on a cold winter day before driving is better for your car. Sorry. Almost all cars on the road today are fuel injected. These systems don't need to be warmed up to run well. Anything over about 30 seconds is just a waste of fuel. Easy acceleration until you feel heat coming out of your vents is not a bad idea, however.
- Tires should be inflated to the pressure listed on the sidewall. False! That's the maximum pressure. The manufacturer of the tire has no idea how heavy a vehicle that tire will end up on. Tires should be inflated to the pressures specified by the vehicle manufacturer and that information is always on the driver's door jamb.
- A dealership must perform your vehicle's regular maintenance to keep the factory warranty valid. So not true. If you have records to show the scheduled maintenance was performed, you can go to any trusted auto repair shop.
- Newer transmissions never need a fluid change. Wrong! Some manufacturers say their transmissions have fluid that lasts a lifetime. No mechanic will agree. A 'lifetime' to the manufacturer is until the warranty runs out. After that you get to pay for a new transmission...
- The 'Codes' you can obtain from your vehicle tells you what's wrong. Incorrect. Those codes tell the technician where to start looking – it takes more testing and troubleshooting to diagnose the root cause. Think of going to the doctor – the code is you telling the doctor your shoulder hurts – it takes an MRI or other tests to find out why those nerves are reporting a problem...
- The only fluid you really need to change in your car is the oil. This may not be a myth, but it seems like most people only worry about their oil. Every fluid in your car has a lifespan, and once it has reached that point, just like dirty oil, it starts to damage the components it is supposed to protect. Coolant gets acidic and eats away aluminvum engine components, brake fluid becomes water saturated and corrosion occurs in the master cylinder, lines, and calipers. Power steering and gear oil become saturated with metal particulates and wear out seals.
- You should change your oil every 3,000 miles. A waste of money. Conventional oil will last around 3500 miles, but most modern vehicles require synthetic oil which is good for 5,000 miles. Be wary of going longer than that even if the manufacturer says you can. The oil viscosity may still be good, but the oil gets dirty, and the filter clogged. All the mechanics I know won't go past 5,000 with their personal vehicles.
- It is dangerous to pump gas while on your cell phone. Why? We used to think they could cause a spark and ignite the fuel vapors. Well, that has never happened like NEVER. So, if you see the signs, it's more likely the owner of the station doesn't want you to be distracted while walking around all the moving cars.
- If you buy gas in the morning, you will get more for your money. Seems logical it is cooler out so the gas will be denser than it will be in the hot afternoon. False! That gas is stored in the ground where the temperature is relatively constant. It has no idea if it is hot or cold out or what time of day it is when it is pumped up and out to your car.
- Filling your tires with nitrogen has a lot of benefits. This one is a huge scam. If you are looking for a tenth of a second per lap on the racecourse, then have at it. But for passenger cars and trucks the tiny gains in more stable pressures and all the other 'benefits' touted have been proven to be so negligible as to be worthless. The air you breath and inflate your tires with is 78 percent nitrogen already!


